

Metagenomics: A New Direction in Ecology REPORT

The seminar was started at 11AM and Mr. Rinsad, Secretary, Biotechnology Association was the coordinator and welcome speech and Ms. Radwa, First year BSc Biotechnology delivered the vote of thanks. Dr. Mashhoor K, Head, Department of Biotechnology delivered the presidential address. Prof. Abdurazaque (Principal incharge), Mr. Fuad, Chairman, Students Union were addressed the gathering.

Description of Course content delivered in the seminar:

Metagenomics is the genomic examination of microorganisms through the direct extraction and cloning of DNA from a collection of microorganisms (also known as environmental and community genomics). Metagenomics was created in response to the indisputable finding that the great majority of organisms in the majority of earthly settings are as-yet-uncultured microbes. This proof came from analysis of 16S rRNA gene sequences amplified from the environment, a method that avoided the bias introduced by culture and resulted in the discovery of enormous new lineages of microbial life. The analysis of 16S rRNA genes revolutionised our understanding of the microbial world, however these studies mostly produced phylogenetic descriptions of the membership of communities with little information about the genetics, physiology, and biochemistry of the individuals. Studying the physiology and ecology

of environmental microbes is made easier by the second-tier technological advancement that metagenomics offers. Metagenomics has led to the identification of novel genes and gene products, such as the first bacteriorhodopsin of bacterial origin, novel small molecules with antimicrobial activity, and new members of known protein families. A community's energy and nutrition cycle, genome structure, gene function, population genetics and microheterogeneity, and lateral gene transfer between uncultured community members have all been revealed through the reassembling of numerous genomes. The use of metagenomic sequencing data will make it easier to develop improved culturing techniques to connect genomic analysis with pure culture investigations.



DBT JRF (Department of Biotechnology Junior Research Fellowship): This fellowship exam is conducted by the Department of Biotechnology, Government of India, to provide fellowships for pursuing research in biotechnology-related fields. BITS HD (Birla Institute of Technology and Science Higher Degree): BITS Pilani conducts this exam for admission to various postgraduate programs, including M.Tech. Biotechnology. Manipal Entrance Test (MET): Manipal Academy of Higher Education conducts this entrance exam for admission to its M.Tech. Biotechnology program. State-Level Entrance Exams: In addition to national-level exams, many states in India have their own entrance exams for admission to state-affiliated universities and colleges offering biotechnology programs. International Exams: If you're considering studying biotechnology abroad, many universities might require standardized tests like the GRE (Graduate Record Examination) or IELTS/TOEFL (for English proficiency), depending on the country and university's requirements. Technical session-1

Introduction

constitution, it is necessary for every student to come forward and serve as foundation of nation to brush up values to fulfill the aims of democracy.

The inaugural session was concluded by vote of thanks by Dr. Ashraf valoor(Seminar Coordinator). After the inaugural session has been winded up, the national seminar moved to two sessions of paper presentation from various UG,PG students and Research Scholars for different colleges and universities across Kerala.

Technical session-1

The first technical session began at 11:30 with five paper presentation with topics relating to various areas of India democracy digging through Social democracy, Representative democracy, Feminist politics, Politics of Decentralisation and Minority representation. The session under the chairship of Firoz K T(HoD, Dept of West Asian Studies) witnessed the information and analysis packed talk of Dr K S Madhavan(Associate Proffesor, Dept of History, University of Calicut). Trajectory of India Democracy: Marginal and Representation stood as a theme for his talk and all papers.

Madhavan's talk wrapped how and what means the democracy fears the state of marginal society and how it would affect whole structure of democarcy. He pointed several incidents contributed to the same. Dr. Sreejesh NP(Asst Prof, Dept of Political Science, University of Calicut) opened the account of paper presentation stressing on crisis in Indian Democracy clearing out how a social democracy could be built through strong political processes wiping out the social revolution. Rahma Binth Latheef, scholar from Indira Gandhi Open University threw a clear picture of how Representative Democracy brought it's development to light through different historical context. Technical session-2

Changing natue of Indian Democracy: The phantom federalism and state politics in India stood as the debating topic of second technical session. Dr Sabu K Thomas (Professor, HoD, dept of political science, university of Calicut) chaired and delivered the keynote address making a beginning to the session. Research scholar from University of Hyderabad, Thahir Jamal unwrapped the session by gathering points on "To be or not to be a community: Muslims and questions of democracy. 
