BRIDGE COURSE 2021

A bridge course for newly admitted students is conducted every year before the commencement of the first semester classes. The main objective is to bridge the gap between subjects studied at pre-university and subjects they would be studying in graduation. The syllabus was framed exclusively, in such a way that they get basic knowledge on the subjects. Five days class was devised by teachers for the enhancement and development of students to make them familiar with the subjects. Dr. Mashhoor K., Shilly Das A, Dr. Somy Soman and Reameesa K the assistant professors of department of Biotechnology were handled the sessions.

At the end of the session a post bridge course test was conducted on 24/11/2021 to assess the students. 20 questions were framed and 40 students took the test. Based on their performance the students were streamlined in to advanced, intermediate and basic level respectively.

Among the 40 students, 9 excelled with full score and only a minimum was found to be at the basic level. Rest of them students got a good score.

Bridge course proved to be more effective to assess the ability of the students. suggestions were given to students for improvisation and boosted confidence in them. The basic level students were recommended for remedial coaching class.







A bridge course for newly admitted students is conducted every year before the commencement of the first semester classes. The main objective is to bridge the gap between subjects studied at pre-university and subjects they would be studying in graduation. The syllabus was framed exclusively, in such a way that they get basic knowledge on the subjects. Five days class was devised by teachers for the enhancement and development of students to make them familiar with the subjects. Mr.K.T.Firoz , DR.Nizar.U, Dr. Asharaf Valoor ,Dr.Afsal .P.S and Dr.Shamsudheen the assistant professors of department of West Asian Studies were handled the sessions.

At the end of the session a post bridge course test was conducted on 23/11/2021 to assess the students. 15 questions were framed and 58 students took the test. Based on their performance the students were streamlined in to advanced, intermediate and basic level respectively.

Among the 58 students,excelled with full score and only a minimum was found to be at the basic level. Rest of them students got a good score.

Bridge course proved to be more effective to assess the ability of the students. suggestions were given to students for improvisation and boosted confidence in them. The basic level students were recommended for remedial coaching class.







BRIDGE COURSE 2021

A bridge course for newly admitted students is conducted every year before the commencement of the first semester classes. The main objective is to bridge the gap between subjects studied at pre-university or Plus Two and subjects they would be studying in graduation. The syllabus was framed exclusively, in such a way that they get basic knowledge on the subjects. Five days class was devised by teachers for the enhancement and development of students to make them familiar with the subjects.

At the end of the session a post bridge course test was conducted on 22/11/2021 to assess the students. A question paper is designed with **10 questions** and **15 students** attended the test.

Among the 20 students, 6 scored 75% and above marks and others scored more than 50% in the test.

Bridge course proved to be more effective to assess the ability of the students. suggestions were given to students for improvisation and boosted confidence in them. The basic level students were recommended for remedial coaching class.



BRIDGE COURSE REPORT

FIRST SEMESTER BA ENGLISH 2021-2022

The PG department of English is established to uplift the students into social scenario by improving their communication skills and other interpersonal skills. Department and faculties are well aware of the requirement of students and their hurdles, probably facing when they enter to a new system. Most of the students are from poor social background and from Malayalam medium school. This programme helps the students to learn and relearn English language for effective communication. This course intends to help students to get over their hesitation and pick up confidence. Evaluation test after the bridge course assesses the progress of the students. Thus, Bridge course proves to be the best opportunity for the students to adapt themselves to the new academic and social environment.

Objectives of the course

- Provide a rationale for literature and literary studies as a discipline of study.
- Introduce the students to the many forms and genres of literature.
- Sensitize them to the tool of reading literary text with a particular focus on their historical, cultural, discursive and aesthetics matrix.
- Establish a sense of literary tradition.
- Provide introductory training in writing and speaking.

Course Duration

Course duration is 5 hours and it is decided to take from core paper hours. Proficient teachers are assigned to deliver each module.

Course Outcome

- Greater sensitization towards the role of historical, cultural and socio-political forces in the production of literary text.
- To acquaint the students with different literary theories.
- Patches up their difficulties in Basic English both written and spoken.

The PG Department of English conducted Bridge course for newly admitted BA English programme students from 15/11/2021 to 19/11/2021. Roy PP, Head of the Department of English, inaugurated the course and ignited the young minds with his interactive session. Entry and Achievement tests were conducted to assess the progress and language capability of the students. Around 63 students reaped the benefit of the course. The five-day course was exclusively conducted for the students with the objective to develop their confidence and proficiency in the use of English Language. Achievement test was conducted on 23rd November.





Session 1

An outline of the BA English programme was given by Roy PP, Head of the Department. In this session, he provided a sheer analysis of the whole programme especially attendance, evaluation and the syllabus.

Session 2

Module 2: Essential English (Basic grammar)

Irfana Parveen, Assistant Professor, Department of English handled the second session. This session enhanced the previous knowledge of the students with basic elements of grammar. It was a platform to know and recall many facts in grammar. She pointed out the common errors committed in English language. This session focused elaborately the rules and usages of tenses with its types.

Session 3

Module 3: History & Development of English Literature

Abidha KP, Assistant Professor, Department of English dealt with the third session. She described the trajectory of English Literature upto present. All the important literary periods, writers and their works were discussed in this session.

Session 4

Module 4: Literary Genres

In this session, Faseela PA Assistant Professor, Department of English elucidated different literary genres of English literature. Poetry and its types, drama and fiction were detailed with examples. This session urged students to read more literary works and recommended a few books to read and analyze themselves.

Session 5

Module 5: An Overview of Literary Theory

Abdul Jaleel M. Assistant Professor, Department of English directed this session and provided an overview of literary theory and its practices. He taught the students how to critically analyse a book and a movie based on the theory learned.

BASICS OF ACCOUNTING & MANAGEMENT

The department offers a bridge course in Basic Accountancy for non-commerce background students. The main objective of this course is to bring non-commerce students at par with those who had accounts in 12th standard. This will help non-commerce students to have a basic understanding of the accounting concepts before their regular classes begin. This course enables the study of basic accounts and applying them to business theory in general. It aims to provide the accounting foundations necessary for business, and finance. It will help in mastering basic concepts of financial and business accounting.

Bridge courses are a tool to help students succeed in their graduate level studies. Faculty of Business Administration has conducted bridge course for newly enrolled students of BBA programs. Students who take admission to BBA program from other streams are required to enroll themselves for bridge course to strengthen and refresh some of the core competencies required. Faculty of Business Administration organized one bridge course during academic year **2020-21**, **52** students attended the bridge course, and induction was given on core subjects like accountancy, Management etc.

Basics of Accounting and Management


Webinar on 'DATA COMMUNICATIONS AND NETWORKING on 25/11/2021.





RESOURCE PERSON:




PROCEEDINGS:








Prof. PM Abdurazaque Inaugurating the Programme

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



Online Workshop on FLUTTER on 12/06/2021

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
Event Summary- CTGTBRS2021

Sub theme: Impact of Culture on Accounting Practices Date and Time: 1 July 2021(Thursday); 2.00 PM (IST)

Key role: The program was started with the introductory remarks of Ibrahim PA (Assistant Professor, Department of Commerce, EMEA College of Arts and Science, Kondotty) on the recent changes in accosting policies on the eve of covid surge. The session chaired by Dr Sreesha CH, (HOD, Department of Commerce, PSMO College of Arts and Science, Tirurangadi), Dr. Sreesha was invited the key note speaker.

Dr. Kaneez fathima (Associate Professor, Department of Accounting, University of Nizwa, Sultanate of Oman) was disseminated the key themes and conveyed the core of the subject, **Impact of Culture on Accounting Practices**. Dr Kaneez, described the context of culture on accosting practices through literature evidences as well as the country specific contexts. Dr. kaneez was in the arguments of positive association of culture and accosting practices. The key note speaker strated the discussion by clarifying what, how determine the culture of an organization

The brief summary of Dr. Kaneez is as follows According to research findings, the evolution of accounting is affected by different environmental factors, of which culture is the most important. The effects of cultural, institutional and societal practices on accounting are growing sub-field in accounting theory. The seminal work in the field of how the cultural influence on accounting practices is Hofstede, 1984, followed by Gray's model 1988, further clarified how accounting values corroborate with culture

value. Dr. Kaneez emphasized the influence of organizational culture over the accountancy in general and over the accounting policies chosen by the organizations in particular. The speaker was also shared the Iranian context how culture impacted on accounting practices of Iran. Regarding the turn of Covid on Accounting practices, After the Covid-19 pandemic outbreak spread throughout the world, there are no economies left in the whole world unless declared negatively affected by this virus.

Covid obliterated the transportation sector a while, followed by the tourism and hotel sector. Later it severely impacted in all sectors. According to IAS 10 of the International Accounting Standards, economic units are required to disclose in the Clause of Clarification events after the financial statement preparation period for every possible future impact as a result of the Covid-19 outbreak. The proverb, "if an organization can't be found in Google, it doesn't exist," seems to exemplify shopper conduct today. It ought to be evident that the use of advanced digital channels is significant for brands. It ought to be a movement that organizations should follow if they need to remain severe and develop. Digital marketing became increasingly advanced in 2010 when gadgets' expansion to access digital media prompted unexpected development. Insights created in 2012 and 2013 indicated that advanced promoting was all the while developing. With the improvement of digital marketing during the 2000s, for example, LinkedIn, Facebook, YouTube.

Key Role: The final day, fifth day, of the international webinar series was began with the introductory remarks of Mr. Mohammed Faisal T (Assistant Professor EMEA College of Arts and Science, Kondotty). The program was chaired by Mr. Abdurahman K (HOD, Department of Management, Malabar College, Vengara). Key note speaker of the day, Dr. Hishan Shankar Sanil (Senior Lecture, Azman Hashim International Business School, University of Technology, Malaysia) dessimanted the concept of CSR and how CSR used as growth strategy in the business.

Dr. Sanil, started his discussion on theme by exemplifying the need of CSR for the long term survival of the business and the recent development in the discussion of CSR. The debate on the CSR has been developed a great extent, with new dimensions. CSR has been of great interest not only to financial economists, but also to corporate practitioners. Although CSR has quite a variety of definitions, the consensus is that corporate behavior can no longer be examined from the single dimension of value maximization. It has been shifted the dimensions of CSR to a pyramid model, it include responsibilities, that is, economic, legal, social, and philanthropic, from bottom to top. Dr, Sanil also conceptualized why conceptual changes has been happening for CSR A widely accepted premise in CSR literature is that companies have societal and environmental obligations that go beyond shareholder interests and legal compliance. But, In addition to emphasizing CSR as going beyond minimum legal requirements, now more emphasis is the firm's responsiveness to these social issues. CSR has become a common practice across industries. Seemingly a majority of the companies are interested in various

philanthropic and CSR endeavours. But whether the CSR expenditure is contributing towards needy areas or is contributing to existent funds / schemes is a topic that has various opinions and answers.

Most companies have long practiced some form of corporate social and environmental responsibility with the broad goal of contributing to the well-being of the community and society and on which they depend. Dr. Sanil, added that, with a growing emphasis on corporate social responsibility (CSR), companies must decide how to integrate CSR into their organizational strategy. In the competitive world, the CSR approach often used as leverage for synergizing social and business agendas together.

Dr. Sanil given three broad areas of CSR activities; Focus on Philanthropy, Improving operational effectiveness & Transforming the business model. It is neither practical nor logical for all companies to engage in same types of CSR. Programmes are driven by diverse factors, including the industry and the societal environment in which the businesses operate and the motivations of the people who run and govern each company. Hence the companies undertake different activities under different social heads, for instance, some may be in education or others may be in rural development or health sector.

The pandemic time is the great opportunities to show the companies commitment to society at large, by doing so, the company create long term business image. Here comes the importance of CSR, which played a crucial role in the times of this pandemic, when people are trying their level best to get through the challenging times. CSR is a 'self-regulating business model' that implies the procedures of interaction by a company with its stakeholders and the general public at large, creating a scenario of being socially responsible. During the period of covid, the companies have been working for the benefits of the socity in two ways, firstly, the closed all their operation as precautionary to stop the wide spreading of the virus(for instance, transportation and hotel industry) on the other hand they also with government programs for prevention and recovery the bad stage of the covid.

In the conclusion remarks, Dr. Sanil emphasized that. All the efforts of the companies is to create long term value creation which eventually makeover the wealth maximization of the business. Hence it is inferred that CSR activities always penetrated to create wealth generation and it often associated with the growth strategies of the firm.

The programs comes to the end by the concluding remarks of the Chair, he also affirmed the Dr Sanil's views on CSR is the part of the growth strategy. In the end, Mrs Jaseena (Assistant Professor, Department of Commerce, EMEA College of Arts and Science, Kondotty) Delivered vote of thanks






Day 1 [9-08-2021] : Overview of Moodle LMS

To understand the structure and conformational changes of outer membrane protein complexes in the native membrane and intact E. coli, with the help of an in-situ pulsed ESR spectroscopy technique

WEBINAR SUMMARY

Membrane proteins frequently traverse a vast energy landscape and endure significant conformational changes while performing their functions. A structural biologist's dream is to examine them in their natural habitat, the cell. However, it has not yet been possible to recreate a membrane protein structure in situ with adequate precision.

Membrane transport mechanisms

The transport of various substances through the cellular membrane is critical to the operation of cells and organelles. The chemical potential energy could drive transport when molecules move along a concentration gradient. Membrane transporters, on the other hand, frequently transport substrates against a concentration gradient. They connect an external energy source with substrate translocation to overcome such an energy barrier. The energy may come from ATP, an electrochemical gradient, or light, depending on the transporter. Gram-negative bacteria are becoming more resistant to antibiotics, resulting in increased sickness, healthcare expenses, and mortality. Their cell envelope is made up of two membranes: an inner membrane (IM) that surrounds the cytoplasm and an outer membrane (OM) that shields the cells from the environment. Phospholipids (PL) and lipopolysaccharides (LPS) make up the OM, which is an asymmetric bilayer (LPS). In addition, the OM contains a large number of - barrel proteins (outer membrane proteins, OMPs). Both LPS and OMPs are produced in the cytoplasm and then transferred to the OM via the periplasm.

The LPS transport system in E. coli is made up of seven key proteins called that traverse the entire cell membrane. Similarly, the Bam subunits of the -Barrel Assembly Machinery (BAM) mediate the folding and insertion of OMP precursors from the periplasm into the OM.

The BAM complex – β -barrel folding and insertion mechanism

The core -barrel BamA appears in either an inward-open or lateral-open conformation in the two known structures for the BAM full-complex. Those conformational changes are thought to be linked to OMP folding and insertion via an unknown mechanism. Because the BAM complex includes the asymmetric outer membrane, mechanistic studies must be conducted in entire cells or natural membranes. We're investigating how BAM conformational changes are linked to protein folding and insertion using the in-situ ESR technique that we've demonstrated throughout the years.

The Lpt System - lipopolysaccharide (LPS) transport mechanism

The tans-periplasmic bridge, which consists of LptC, LptA, and the N-terminal domain of LptD, transfers LPS molecules from the inner membrane to the outer membrane in the Lpt system. It's thought that the ABC exporter LptB2FG, which is found in the inner membrane, extracts LPS molecules and pushes them through the periplasm at the expense of ATP hydrolysis. Individual component structures have been determined. We're looking at how the subunits interact to produce the supramolecular trans-envelope complex, as well as how ATP hydrolysis at the inner membrane drives LPS transport through the periplasmic bridge and into the outer membrane. **LEARNING OUTCOME**Students will understand about


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



TREKKING AND CLEANING



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
THE PROGRAM REPORT

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
Webinar on 'DATA COMMUNICATIONS AND NETWORKING on 25/11/2021.



"Unravelling the secrets of women health"

Wednesday 23/08/2022

Report

Women experience unique health issues and conditions, from pregnancy and menopause to gynecological conditions, such as uterine fibroids and pelvic floor disorders. The health topics listed below affect women only. Some other conditions affect men too but affect women primarily or more severely.

Gynecological health and disorders affecting women include menstruation and menstrual irregularities; urinary tract health, including urinary incontinence and pelvic floor disorders; and such disorders as bacterial vaginosis, vaginitis, uterine fibroids, and vulvodynia.

Pregnancy issues include pre-pregnancy care and prenatal care, pregnancy loss (miscarriage and stillbirth), preterm labour and premature birth, sudden infant death syndrome (SIDS), breastfeeding, and birth defects.

Disorders related to infertility include uterine fibroids, polycystic ovary syndrome, endometriosis, and primary ovarian insufficiency.


Other disorders and conditions that affect only women include Turner syndrome, Rett syndrome, and ovarian and cervical cancers.

Issues related to women's overall health and wellness include violence against women, women with disabilities and their unique challenges, osteoporosis and bone health, and menopause.

While both men and women contract various conditions, some health issues affect women differently and more commonly. Furthermore, many women's health conditions go undiagnosed and most drug trials do not include female test subjects. Even so, women bear exclusive health concerns, such as breast cancer, cervical cancer, menopause, and pregnancy. Women suffer higher heart attack deaths compared to men. Depression and anxiety exhibit more frequently among female patients. Urinary tract conditions present more often in females, and sexually transmitted diseases can cause more harm to women.

About 100 girls attended the seminar. There was an interactive session where students cleared most of their doubts. Overall the program was a great success. Feed back of the program by the students was really good. Vote of thanks was delivered by Ms. Basila of second semester B.Sc Microbiology student.

PRINCIPAL'S CLUB

About the Club:

Principal's Club is a Unique Programme under the Students Advisory Scheme. Students Advisory Scheme has been active in the college and has been closely monitoring the mentoring process and providing timely directions and interventions to enhance the mentor – mentee relationship.

At the institutional level, a set of students is identified as 'Advanced Learners' and thus a 'Principal's Club' is formed. To find out members for these above mentioned categories, an entry level Entrance examination is conducted for all the first year UG students. Special question papers are set having proportionate questions to check the proficiency of students in English language skills, GK and Current Affairs and the subject of their Plus Two Intermediate course. Candidates for these clubs are selected giving equal weightage for their performance in the entrance examination and their Plus Two percentage. The shortlisted candidates are further made to undergo an interview before being included in the final list.

Government of India as well as Kerala spend a huge amount of money to recover from the pandemic. In this context it is better to analyse the financial situation of our state. So the budget is the very good yard stick to measure the financial position of the state. As we know budget is the annual financial statement of government or body. In terms of a state budget presentation is a constitutional obligation. So we have a union budget and a state budget. It was amidst the covid pandemic, financial crisis and the fiscal difficulties the budget of 2022-23 was presented. Thus this impact was very evident on state's revenue, expenditure and debt. This budget was a classic example of times of financial distress.

On 23rd March 2022 at 10 AM the seminar inauguration ceremony was conducted. The programme was hosted by the PG and Research Department of Economics of EMEA College,

Professor Hussain V welcomed the guests of the programme presided by Prof. Muhammed Najeeb.PM, HoD, Department of Economics ,EMEA College Kondotty. After the presidential address Lt. Abdul Rasheed .P (Principal), delivered his principal's address. Dr Ibrahim Cholakkal and Mrs. Haulath. K delivered felicitations. The seminar was inaugurated and keynote address was given by Dr. Shibinu. S and the participants of the seminar asked different questions and their doubts were cleared. It was really a wonderful session with plenty of information about the current financial situations in the economy including revenue, expenditure and debt of the Government. Though the seminar was schedule from 10 AM to 12 PM, it extended till 1.45 due to the active interactions of the participants and paper presentation and discussion by research scholars and PG students .The seminar was wind up with the Vote of Thanks of Sri Hamid Roshan K.K, PG student, EMEA College Kondotty.

Highlights of the Presentation

The current budget was presented during the phase of many challenges especially spurring economic growth and accumulating debt liabilities and the burden of Covid-19. Kerala finance minister Balagopalan Sir "it is the budget that lays the ground for Kerala's long term development". The current budget focuss on many aspects, but it give special emphasis on following categories.

The Rural Development Department is primarily concerned with addressing the needs of the rural people in matters of sustainable economic activity, shelter, hygiene concerns, rural infrastructure and connectivity

EDUCATION:

The budget Rs 2,547 crore has been allocated for the education sector. Out of this, Rs 1,014 crore is for school education, Rs 452 crore for higher education, Rs 245 crore for technological education and Rs 15 crore for special education. The finance minister KN Balagopal said that Rs 350 crores will be allocated for skill parks that will be set up in all 14 districts of Kerala for skill development. The skill park will be set up with private companies in a 50:50 model.

1. HEALTH:

The total outlay provided in the Medical and Public Health Sector during the financial year 2022-23 is □2629.33 crore. Cancer Control programmes, Upgradation of Regional Cancer Centre.

Cochin Cancer Research Centre and Malabar Cancer Centre,Palliative Care,Kerala Digital Health Mission and Institute of Advanced Virology are major parts of health category. An amount of 742.2 crore is expected from centrally sponsored schemes as Central Share. An amount of 484.8 crore and 10 crore is earmarked as state share for National Health Mission and National Ayur Mission respectively. With intention of research, diagnosis and control of viral diseases, Institute of Advanced Virology, Thonnakkal established at a cost of 202 crore with international standards. An amount of 50 crore is provided for arranging modern laboratory facilities, developing vaccines.

4. Public distribution system (PDS):

Kerala government launched several schemes in the public distribution system of the state. The newly introduced reforms will include e-office system in the offices under the Civil Supplies Department, online services at the ration shops and GPS system for surveillance of goods transport. A total of \Box 2063.64 crore is earmarked for Civil Supplies sector for the year 2022-23. This includes plan share of \Box 75.41 crore. Mobile Ration Shops will be opened in major centers of all legislative assembly constituencies in the State. Door step distribution of ration items will be made available through mobile ration shops at the areas where population density of fishermen and scheduled category is high.

5. AGRICULTURE:

The state has allocated 4.5% of its total expenditure towards agriculture and allied activities. This is lower than the average allocation for agriculture by states (6.2%).Giving a big boost to the agriculture sector, the government has set aside Rs 879 crore to empower farmers. The schemes include constitution of a value- added agricultural mission, building infrastructure, promoting mechanized farming and startups and formation of a marketing firm. The budget proposes to constitute Value-added Agricultural Mission to increase state's domestic production from agricultural resources. As a part of this, five working groups will be constituted to formulate strategies. The working groups will formulate schemes and device an integrated scheme. Seven Agritech facility centres will be established in seven districts to encourage value-added farming. These centres will be established in 5 to 10 acres of land owned by agriculture department. These centres will be handed over to farmer collectives.

6. Industry:

The budget gives huge allocations to information technology, industries and infrastructure. Also, the budget did not impose a tax burden on the common man despite the financial crunch induced by the COVID-19 pandemic. The budget allotted Rs 2,000 crore for the K-Rail project. A total of Rs 1100 crore was earmarked for the land acquisition for the new IT parks and the expansion and development of the existing ones. To tap the possibilities of work near home in the IT sector and help engage educated housewives in jobs, Rs 50 crore was earmarked. Rupees 200 crore for industrial facilitation parks, four science parks at an investment of Rs 1000 crore, an electronic hardware technology hub at an investment of Rs 28 crore, an amount of Rs 30 crore is set apart for undertaking activities related to Sabarimala Master Plan and Rs 1,000 crore for the revival of the kerala State Road Transport Corporation.

Details of registration

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


