



Department of Political Science, EMEA College of Arts and Science Kondotty in association with Dr. Bhim Rao Ambedkar chair of University of Calicut, organized an Ambedkar lecture by esteemed academician and social scientist, Sukhdeo Thorat on 23 November 2023 at AVT Hall. The event aimed to offer valuable insights on advancing social justice through policy interventions. The lecture attracted a diverse audience consisting of students, researchers and faculty members from the College and the Department of Political Science, University of Calicut. The speaker elaborated on various policy interventions that aimed to tackle social injustices. He explored examples from different countries and discussed the

He emphasized the importance of evidence-based decision-making and the need to ensure the inclusion of marginalized voices in policy formulation processes.

various aspects of social justice and policy interventions. The speaker's expertise, combined with his engaging delivery, made the lecture a valuable learning experience. #### Report

The inaugural session was welcomed by Mr. Muhammed Shafi T., (Assistant Professor, Department of History West Asian Studies). Prof. K.M. Aboobacker (Secretary, EMEA Institutions) presided over and inaugurated by Mr. Firos K.T., (Head, PG Department of History and West Asian Studies). The keynote address was delivered by Dr. Ashraf Valoor (Head, Department of Political Science) and Felicitation by Dr. Nisar U. and Sehla Kansah P. The inaugural session was ended with the Vote of thanks by Mr. Muhammed Ramees K.P. (Student Coordinator). 54 students were actively participated in the seminar.

#### The Idea of India

The India that was born in 1947 was in a very real sense a new creation. Indian nationalism was not based on any of the conventional indices of national identity. Not language, not ethnicity, not religion, not geography was hacked and not even territory, since, by law, anyone with one grandparent born in pre-partition India – outside the territorial boundaries of today's state – is eligible for citizenship. Indian nationalism has therefore always been the nationalism of an idea.

It is the idea emerging from an ancient civilisation, united by a shared history, sustained by pluralist democracy. India's democracy imposes no narrow conformities on its citizens. The whole point of Indian pluralism is you can be many things and one thing: you can be a good Muslim, a good Keralite and a good Indian all at once. The Indian idea is the opposite of what Freudians call "the narcissism of minor differences, in India we celebrate the commonality of major differences. If America is famously a "melting-pot", then to me India is a thali, a selection of sumptuous dishes in different bowls. Each tastes different, and does not necessarily mix with the next, but they belong together on the same plate, and they complement each other in making the meal a satisfying repast. So the idea of India is of one land embracing many. The Indian idea is that a nation may endure differences of caste, creed, colour, conviction, culture, cuisine, costume and custom, and still rally around a consensus. And that consensus is around the simple idea that in a democracy you don't really need to agree – except on the ground rules of how you will disagree.
